


- The word Islam means peace and obedience.

- This belief is the first pillar of Islam.




The Holy Qur'an

- The Holy Qur'an is the Holy Book for Muslims.
- * It was revealed to the Holy Prophet
 Muhammad (peace and blessings of Allah be
 upon him) by Allah, through the Angel Gabriel
 over a period of 23 years.

Did you know?

The Holy Qur'an is the most memorised and most well-read book in human history! There is also a Holy Qur'an in Braille to help those who are visually impaired.

The Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him)

Who is a role

model for you?

- ❖ The Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) was born in 570 AD in Makkah (also spelt 'Mecca') in Saudi Arabia. He was a prophet and a messenger of Allah. This means that he brought Allah's message of Islam to the world.
- The Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) is a role model for all Muslims.
- The sayings of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be on him) are called 'Hadith'
- The traditions and practices of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be on him) are called 'Sunnah'.

5 Pillars of Islam

- Shadahah (Declaration of Faith)
- Salat (Prayer)
- ❖ Sawm (Fasting)
- Zakat (Charity)
- *Hajj (Pilgrimage)

SALAT

- Salat is a prescribed form of prayer.
- ❖ It is an essential part of being a Muslim.
- ❖ It helps Muslims grow closer to Allah and helps to purify the soul.
- There are 5 Salat prayers a day at various times.
- Prayers can be said at the Mosque or at home on a prayer mat.
- * The Call to Prayer is called the Adhan.
- * Muslims cover their head whilst praying.

Did you know?

The most common type of head covering worn in Britain is the Hijab.

- Observing the veil is part of a Muslim woman's faith.
- ❖ It represents a symbol of protection, respect and dignity.
- ❖ It enables women to be recognised for their intelligence, personality and academic achievements rather than their outward appearance.
