<u>Teaching Input</u>		<u>Reinforcement Points</u>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What is the Holy Qur'an and why is it important to Muslims? Go through the slides (<i>see Teachers' notes for support</i>). Stop after each slide giving the children an opportunity to Think, Pair, Share. Use the link in Slide 3 to watch a short video introducing the Holy Qur'an. Use the Audio Link in Slide 7 to listen to a recitation of the Holy Qur'an. Discuss any unfamiliar vocabulary and start a word wall for the unit. Use the link to an online class quiz to see how much children remember about the topic. Discuss any unfamiliar vocabulary and start a word wall for the unit. 		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children should understand that the Holy Book for Muslims is the Holy Qur'an but that Muslims believe in and accept all the Holy Books sent to Prophets before the Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) (<i>reference slide 6 of the presentation</i>). The Prophet of Islam is the Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) but Muslims believe in all the Prophets, including Prophet Jesus and Prophet Moses (peace be upon them both). These beliefs in all the Holy Books and all the Prophets are both 'Articles of Faith' in Islam which children will learn about in KS2.

<u>Practical Ideas</u>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Show children a copy of the Holy Qur'an, reminding them of the etiquettes that need to be observed when Muslims read it (<i>eg, wash hands, cover head, Holy Qur'an must be respected and not placed on the floor</i>) Have any children in the Class started to read the Holy Qur'an? Invite them to share their experience and invite other children to ask questions.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Holy Qur'an is a very special book for Muslims. Do the children have a book that is very special to them? What is it about? Why is it so special? How do they look after it? Holy Quran Crossword Puzzle.
