Reinforcement Points
 Nurturing peace is a core Islamic value. The word 'Islam' itself means peace. The Holy Prophet of Islam, Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) taught Muslims to respect one another, be tolerant of each other and live peacefully together. The Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) also taught Muslims to respect those of other faiths and to treat everyone fairly Islam condemns any attempts to violate freedom of belief and freedom of conscience. Under no circumstances does Islam permit coercion or force in the matter of religion. Rather, Islam teaches that religion is a matter of the heart.
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Activity 3: the key Islamic ve learnt about box on the mod then answer below it. • Answer the scenario based questions on the worksheet.
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Practical Ideas

- Choose one of the Islamic values we have looked at today. Design a poster with pictures showing how that value is practised.
- Seeking knowledge is an important Islamic value. We can seek knowledge in many ways, for example through reading books. Using a rectangle card cut-out, children to design a book mark for their favourite book. Children may wish to write one of their own values on the bookmark, eg 'be kind', 'be honest', 'be grateful', 'be forgiving', be patient', 'be generous' etc.

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Extension Task

Using a dictionary, ask the children to look up the difference between a 'value' and a 'belief'.
 Children should then make a list of their own values.
